

Spend: Long-term trends (hospo + retail)




Since 2019:

- CBD spend has 'tracked' down
- Suburban spend stable
- Net impact: CBD contributes less to the City
 - Attributed to less visitors and Working from Home

Commuting: Car and CBD bus PAX up

Bus loadings




- Cars: returned to 2019 levels
- CBD bus loadings stabilised at 80% of 2019 levels
 - Driven by Working from Home
 - Despite low fares
 - Aggravated by driver shortage

 - 2022/23 schedule almost at 2019's record levels
- International visitors return
 - Links to US and beyond re-establishing
 - 'Brain Drain' easing off
 - But China taking its time ...
- Long-list of summer events lined up:

 - Strong list of international acts including Guns n' Roses and British comedians Rob Beckett and Sandi Toksvig
 - FIFA Women's World Cup in July
 - La Niña conditions on the Australian East Coast brings excess rain thereby encouraging more visitors here (perhaps)


Cruise ships return

Visitors: Arrival trends




- Trending up
 - Both airports close to 60% of 2019
 - Airlines re-building capacity, constrained by staff availability and risks of entering markets that are re-building

Passenger capacity by area of the world:




Net migration: AKL versus WLG:



- Capacity returning but limited by aircrew
 Australia 66% and rising slowly
- US almost are previous levels
- Asia increasing slowly
- China yet to return

- Pent-up demand for OE + job-change
- AKL A/P: loss reversing
- WLG A/P: 5,000 pa loss
- 'Brain drain' starting to stabilise? Perhaps a suggestion of a recovery?

 Feb/March: i.e. Homegrown as Wellingtonians return home and the weather is more stable
