

We won't be in the Lobby for very long.




Using the Elevators

We will press 16 on the touchpad, to go to Floor 16.

The screen will show us which elevator to take.





Taking the Elevator

The elevator is very strong and safe.

Other people may also take the elevator.

It may stop at different floors.

The screen will show us when we arrive at Floor 16.



Reception

The elevator will take us to Floor 16.

This is where Reception is.

We will turn right, and walk down the hall. This takes us to the Council Chambers.
